Plumbaginaceae

Origin: Sicily, Mediterranean and the European Atlantic coast from Spain to Denmark and the United Kingdom

Weed Description: Cushion forming herbaceous perennial to 25cm high with evergreen broadly spatulate green leaves producing numerous small rosettes, often forming a hemispherical cushion or extensive mat. It has purple and white flowers with branched flower heads held above the foliage.

Reproduction and Dispersal: Seeds dispersed by water, soil, human movement and survive long periods in seawater. It is an apomictic plant which means that every flower produces seed but not by sexual reproduction. An infestation usually spreads via budding from rhizomes.

Habitat: Sicilian sea lavender invades saltmarsh and coastal rocky areas, tolerates harsh high salt environments.
